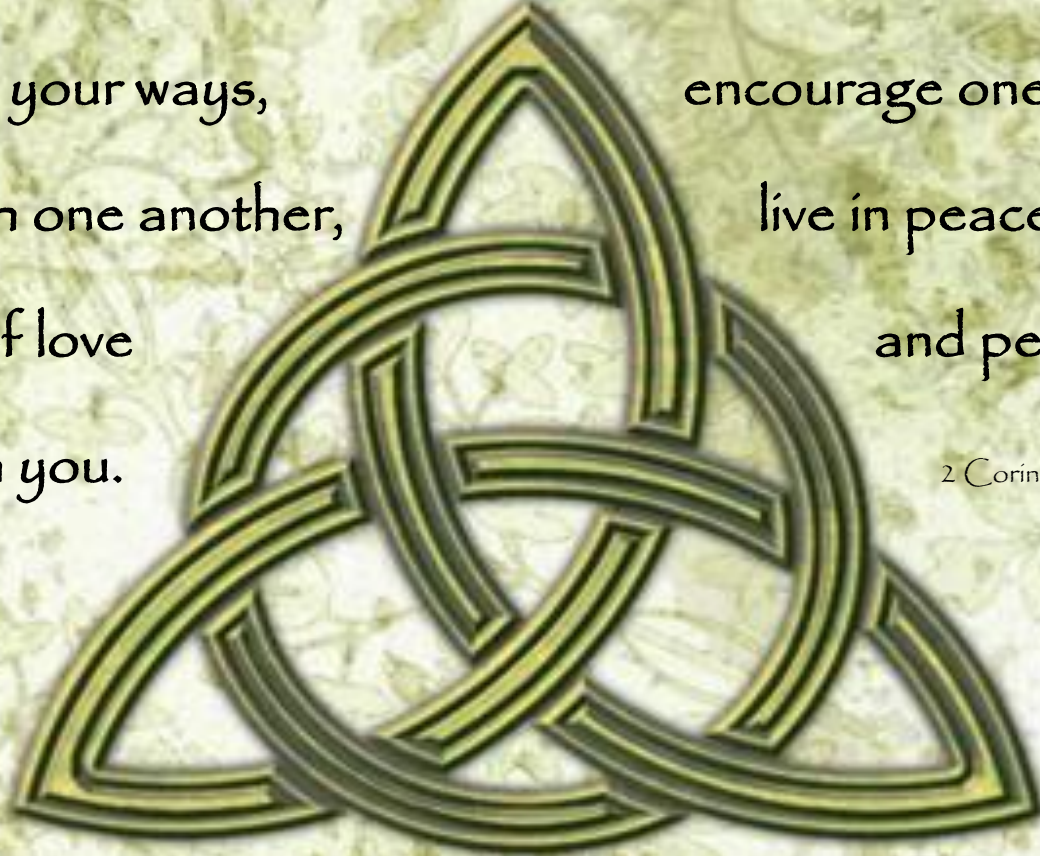

Homelessness is a reality in Spokane.

As in other communities, the causes of homelessness
are many: lack of affordable housing and good paying
jobs, domestic violence, health care expenses, poverty,
mental illness, substance abuse. Many people and
agencies are addressing local homelessness.
